In Zanzibar, we ran a full two week TS1 BELT seminar. In Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania, we taught a small community (15 people plus their families) of leaders from a local church for five days. We had 36 graduates from the BELT seminar in Zanzibar. The BELT participants' outreaches were in a Muslim community and report 10 people giving their lives to Jesus or recommitting their lives to Him.

Bible School for the Nations: Tanzania	Staff from YWAM Madison and graduates from the BSN began the first BSN in Tanzania this fall with 7 students from Africa and Europe.
FreakFest Outreach	This was our 9 th year doing an outreach on Langdon Street for FreakFest. Volunteers and staff prayed for people at a dedicated prayer station on the Phos House enclosed porch. Volunteers had significant conversations with students and shared the love of Jesus with them. Before and during the outreach, people were inside praying for the students and worshipping God.
15 New Staff join our team	The new staff are welcomed into the community through the two-week "Connect," which is our new staff training. Most of these new staff are joining to work with training schools. A major staff need is a kitchen administrator.
Local Outreach: Yahara Gardens	Every Tuesday, the Garden team, along with volunteers from the neighborhood and churches, harvested and sold fresh produce as a CSA (community supported agriculture). Lucy ran a kids' club at the same time with activities for neighborhood children. They have reached at least 50 area families. It has been good for public relations as well!
Phos House	I3 students are living at the Phos House this fall semester. They take part in worship, Bible studies, and outreaches. BPTN leads one of the Bible studies. Volunteers who did DTS in Townsville, Australia have joined the community.
Local Outreach: Meals on Wheels	Our staff take turns each week bringing nutritious meals to the elderly and disabled on Madison's northeast side.
Regional Go Conference	The Go Conference 2015 was held at New Life Ranch in Oklahoma, attracting 140 staff and students between Minnesota to Texas. Speakers included Fred Markert and Colleen Milstein, focusing on Strategic Missions and Biblical Justice Missions.
YWAM Kids Preschool	Katie Roest (alumni, volunteer staff) began a preschool for YWAM kids ages 4 and 5 that runs a few mornings a week at the GMC.

Staff in Latvia	The Stenson family was in Latvia from May - Sept, helping run a teen discipleship program.
	The Young family is in Latvia from Sept - April, working alongside another YWAM center that ministers to women in the sex trade.
54 Days of Prayer	Inspired by Isaiah 54, our community committed to 54 days of prayer. Themes included prayers for expansion, reviewing strategies and vision God gave us in the past, and seeking God for new vision for the future. New initiatives were also presented to the staff at this time.
Silk Road Initiative	The third DTS graduated, with 11 Chinese students. Another DTS begins April 4. A second BSN, with 7 students, graduates January 4.
